

7. **Medická záhrada**

Medická záhrada is the most popular public park. Wide lawns, flowerbeds and trees offer ideal conditions for your free time activities.

8. **Namestie SNP – Openair Dancing**

A street party without open-air dancing is not complete. We will not only enjoy the nice square but also will spread the tango love in Bratislava with the motto of "Tango is where you feel home"

9. Blue Church

A fairy-tale like church. It has the same colour as the sky – and its name comes from its colour. Its facade is blue. Its mosaics are blue. Its majolicas are blue. And not only outside, also the interior is painted in shades of pale blue.



10. Botanic garden

Botanical Garden offers beautiful plants outside in the garden and a wonderful greenhouse collection.

11. Bratislava castle

Bratislava Castle is one of the oldest castles in Slovakia. The first written information about the castle dates from 907. You can find there the Slovak National Museum's collection from the Museum of History and a unique Jewel, or the remains of Great Moravian construction.



12. Devin castle



The castle which witnessed the glory and fall of Great Moravia and was blown up by Napoleon's army. Situated on a high cliff over the Morava and Danube rivers, and standing on the frontier between Slovakia and Austria, it offers beautiful panoramic views and is a very popular place to visit.

14. House at the Good Shepherd

This 250 years old rococo-style house is one of the most interesting historical buildings in Bratislava. Currently it is a museum of clocks.



15. Hviezdoslavovo námestie with the historical building of the Slovak National Theatre



One of the most famous squares in Bratislava is Hviezdoslavovo námestie with lots of greenery and fountains. At the end of the square you can see the historical building of the Slovak National Theatre

16. Magio city beach

City beach on the Danube. Stylish, warm sand under your feet - ideal place for relaxation.

17. Main Square

Main Square with the statue of Napoleon and Roland Fountain - place where many concerts are organized and where you can admire many historical buildings.



18. Man at work (Čumil)



„The watcher.“ There are two possible explanations for his name. The first rumour says that he is a typical communist era worker who doesn't care about his work. According to the second rumour, he's looking under the women's skirts. Choose the one you like the most.

19. Michaels Gate and Tower

One of the main entrances to the Old Town and the only gate that remained of the original four gates in Bratislava fortifications. Currently it is a museum of antique weapons.



20. Museum of Natural History

It is situated in an old beautiful building next to the river bank. It offers permanent exhibitions and very interesting temporary exhibition.



21. Old City Hall - Museum of City History



This is the oldest museum of Bratislava, documenting the history of the city from the medieval ages. The Town Hall Tower offers a beautiful view on the Main square, the castle and other important sights.

22. Oldest souvenir shop & museum of trade

This place with reminds a shop from the early 20th century. In the back you can find a small museum with old silver cash machines and other antique shop equipment. You can buy a wide variety of good-quality local food products and special souvenirs.

23. Presidential Palace



Presidential Palace is a rococo building known as Slovakia's White House. It is the official seat of the President of the Slovak Republic. Its large French garden is definitely worth visiting.

24. Primate's Palace

Considered as one of the most beautiful buildings in Bratislava. It was built in the 18th century and offers large oil portraits of Habsburg royalties, sparkling crystal chandeliers, tapestries and the Hall of Mirrors. In the courtyard, there is also the fountain and statue of St. George. The palace is the seat of the Mayor of Bratislava.



25. Shopping centre Eurovea with the New building of the Slovak National Theatre



Shopping centre Eurovea with promenade on the Danube. Near the centre there is the New building of the Slovak National Theatre.

26. Slavín war memorial

Slavin is a memorial and the only operational military cemetery in Bratislava. It is one of the popular tourist attractions of Bratislava. It is a popular place especially for its location and its terraces which offer breath taking views of Bratislava.



27. Slovak National Gallery

Different exhibitions of modern and classical art including Gothic and Baroque sculptures and paintings are exposed here. The building is a national cultural monument. The entrance is free.

28. St. Martin's Cathedral:



It is the largest, oldest and most visited temple in Bratislava in which Queen Maria Theresa was crowned. Make sure you visit its underground crypt with its catacombs.

95m above the ground, you can enjoy the beautiful view of Bratislava
